

Polyclonal Antibody to Goat IgG [H&L] -FITC-

Alternate names: Goat Immunoglobulin G

Immunogen: Goat IgG whole molecule.

Format: State: Lyophilized purified Ig fraction.

Buffer System: 0.02 M Potassium Phosphate, 0.15 M Sodium Chloride, pH 7.2, containing 10 mg/ml BSA (IgG and Protease free) as stabilizer and 0.01% (w/v) Sodium Azide as

preservative.

Absorption / Emission: 495 nm / 528 nm

Molar Ratio: 3.9 moles FITC per mole of Donkey IgG.

Reconstitution: Restore with 1.0 ml of deionized water (or equivalent).

Applications: Suitable for Immunomicroscopy and Flow cytometry or FACS analysis as well as other

antibody based fluorescent assays requiring lot-to-lot consistency.

Recommended Dilutions: FLISA: 1/10,000-1/50,000. IF Microscopy: 1/1,000-1/5,000. Flow Cytometry: 1/500-1/2,500.

Other applications not tested. Optimal dilutions are dependent on conditions and should

be determined by the user.

Specificity: This product was prepared from monospecific antiserum by immunoaffinity

chromatography using Goat IgG coupled to agarose beads followed by solid phase

adsorption(s) to remove any unwanted reactivities.

Assay by immunoelectrophoresis resulted in a single precipitin arc against

anti-Fluorescein, anti-Donkey Serum, Goat IgG and Goat Serum.

No reaction was observed against Chicken, Guinea Pig, Hamster, Horse, Mouse, Rabbit and

Rat Serum Proteins.

Store vial at 2-8°C prior to restoration.

Store undiluted at 2-8 °C for one month or (in aliquots) at -20 °C for long term storage.

Dilute only prior to immediate use. Avoid repeated freezing and thawing. Shelf life: One year from despatch.
